All applications received by the Public Authority were considered and best efforts were made to furnish the desired information in case it did not fall within the exemptions enumerated in Section 8 of the Act. In case, the applications concerned some other Public Authority partly or in full, the same were forwarded to such Public Authority under Section 6(3) of the Act, to enable the applicant to get the desired information. Efforts were made, wherever required, to provide necessary assistant to facilitate the applicants to get the desired information. The Public Authority is conscious of its obligation under the RTI Act to put as much information as possible in the public domain and efforts in this direction are continuing in order to obviate the need to resort to formal application for seeking information.
